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# 1. Purpose

1.1 This standard operating procedure describes the procedures for diagnostic services.

### 2. Scope

2.1 This procedure is to be followed by staff designated for providing diagnostic services.

## 3. Responsibilities

3.1 All designated staff for diagnostic services should follow this procedure.

5.	Otoscope	Veterinarian	Examine and note the observations
6.	Tonometer	Veterinarian	Examine and note the observations

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
#### 4. Definitions

- **4.1 AHD:** It refers to Animal Health Division under the Department of Livestock.
- 4.2 **Animal attendant:** It refers to a person who helps in restraining of animals and ensures the well being of the animals during the treatment procedures.
- 4.3 **Anesthesia:** It refers to insensitivity to pain, especially as artificially induced by the administration of gases or the injection of drugs before surgical operation.
- 4.4 **DoL:** It refers to Department of Livestock.
- 4.5 **DRA:** It refers to Drug Regulatory Authority.
- 4.6 **DVH:** It refers to Dzongkhag Veterinary Hospital.
- **4.7 Diagnostic services:** It refers to the imaging and laboratory capabilities available for determining the cause of an illness.
- 4.8 Diagnostic Procedure: The process of identifying or determining the nature and cause of a disease or injury through evaluation of patient history, examination and review of laboratory data.
- 4.9 Effective Date: It is the date that a document becomes effective for use.
- **4.10 Endoscopy:** It is a process of examining the internal organs by introducing endoscope into the body.
- 4.11 **LAN:** It refers to local area network.
- 4.12 **Muzzle:** It refers to a device used to cover the animal's snout.
- 4.13 **NVH:** It refers to National Veterinary Hospital, Thimphu.
- **4.14 Ophthalmoscope:** It refers to an instrument for inspecting the retina and other parts of eye.
- 4.15 **Otoscope:** It refers to an instrument for visual examination of eardrum.
- 4.16 **Para-veterinarian:** It refers to a person with diploma in Animal Science and is authorized to provide treatment to the animals.
- **4.17 Restrain:** It refers to application of any procedure designed to restrict its movements in order to facilitate examination of patient.
- 4.18 **SOP:** It refers to Standard Operating Procedure.
- 4.19 **Staff:** It refers to veterinarians, para-veterinarians and animal attendants.
- 4.20 **TVH:** It refers to Thomde Veterinary Hospital.
- **4.21 Technician:** It refers to technical staff involved in diagnostic procedure.
- 4.22 **Tonometer:** It refers to an instrument to measure eye pressure.
- 4.23 **Ultrasonography:** It is a technique using echoes of ultrasound pulses to delineate objects or areas of different density in the body.
- 4.24 **Veterinarian:** It refers to a person holding a bachelors degree in Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry and is authorized to practice veterinary medicine.
- 4.25 **X-ray:** It refers to an electromagnetic wave of high energy and very short wavelength (between ultraviolet light and gamma rays), which is able to pass through many materials opaque to light.

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#### 6. Procedure

- 6.1 The technical staff should wear clinical dress (blue) or white lab coat (properly buttoned) with nametag.
- 6.2 Note down the case number and the details of the patient in the register.
- 6.3 Prepare the patient for the diagnostic procedure.

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- 6.4 Restraining of patient.
- 6.5 Ask the owner to put dog muzzle to prevent from biting.
- 6.6 Advise the owner to hold the patient properly to carry out the procedures.
- 6.7 Make friend or get familiar with the patient to ease handling by calling their names with gentle patting of head and body.
- 6.8 Induction of anesthesia if necessary.
  - 6.8.1 Inform and give awareness to the owner about the risk of anesthesia and let them sign the consent form to carry out the procedure.
  - 6.8.2 Prepare line of anesthesia as per the body weight of the patient.
  - 6.8.3 Locate the vein by clipping the hairs either on cephalic or saphenous vein.
  - 6.8.4 Disinfect the site and connect IV line for injecting anesthesia.
  - 6.8.5 Inject the anesthesia by monitoring the patient or as per the calculated doses.
- 6.9 Shaving of hair if necessary.
- 6.10 Use of protective gears such as lead jackets and gloves in case of X-ray.
- 6.11 Perform the procedures as recommended by the veterinarians.
  - 6.11.1 X-ray
  - 6.11.2 Ultrasonography
  - 6.11.3 Endoscopy
  - 6.11.4 Ophthalmoscopy
  - 6.11.5 Otoscope
  - 6.11.6 Tonometer
- 6.12 Generate report of the procedure performed and upload on LAN.
- 6.13 Clean the equipment and machinery after the procedures.
- 6.14 Use rectified spirit to clean the equipment and make sterile for next use.
